### **Lady's lucky night**

I took 10 glass tips of each size, and then buffed them to remove shine. To create a gaming table, first I painted 7 tips using grass green powder, buffed them and applied a uv gloss coat.

Then I put the other 3 tips together to create a roulette wheel. I started from the center:

- the wheel was made with twilight brown powder,
- black, red and green powder were used to create the number fields on the wheel
- the numbers and fine lines were painted with white powder.

After applying acrylic I covered the tips with clear gel and then applied a uv gloss coat,

- the bowl was made with twilight brown and dark twilight brown powder
- the roulette ball was made with white powder

The poker cards were made over four tips using ultra white powder:

- Hearts and diamonds were made with red powder, and spades and clubs with black powder,
- The aces on the cards were made with black acrylic paint,
- the edge of each card was painted with golden shimmer powder

I covered the tips with clear gel.

The Lady's hand was made with warm pink powder.

Red powder was used to create the nail plate, and golden shimmer powder and red acrylic paint for the bracelet.

The Lucky 7s were painted with dark blue, black and yellow powder.

The dice were made with yellow, orange, pink and red powders.

First I made them flat, then I applied black dots using black powder, and then I covered the tips with clear gel.

To create a 3d look I reapplied the color powders to the upper sides of the dice, and applied silver powder to the edges and clear powder to the sides. I finished with a uv gloss coat.

Gaming money was made with white and yellow powder and covered with clear gel. The chips were made with light turquoise powder, covered with clear gel and then rounded with silver powder. Red, white, yellow and orange powders were used to create numbers. The dots on the chips were painted with acrylic colors: white, light blue, green, red, orange, golden, and yellow using the tip of a No. 2 brush. The chips bag was made with mocha powder and bronze acrylic paint. Neutral pink powder was used to create the edge and the highlights, and red powder was used to create the lace.

All acrylic designs were created using a No.5 brush.
